When we meet on April 24, there will be a lot to discuss and decide. Most importantly, we will be electing a new executive. All ITA members are free to run for any position on the executive. Bargaining Update

Playing the hand you're dealt might have been an expression that could have applied to the bargaining process this time around. However, so far, no new cards have been dealt. The government has passed Bill 28 but, as of this writing, that Bill has not been proclaimed and is therefore not in effect. The government has announced provincial bargaining, but, so far, has not introduced any enabling legislation. Our current collective agreement expires June 30, 2018. In accordance with that agreement, the Public Schools Act, and the Labour Relations Act we will commence the bargaining process as we have done at the conclusion of every collective agreement in the past. I commend our bargaining chair, Maria Nickel, and the hard-working Collective Bargaining Steering Committee for completing the Association's opening package in the week before Spring Break. That package will go to the Executive for approval in early April and we will then be ready to engage in collective bargaining. Thank you to all of you who completed our survey and sent in bargaining suggestions. Bargaining takes teamwork, and there is no doubt we have a strong team.
