President's Message

When speaking about the ITA AGM, I have frequently stated that this is the one day of the year that your union needs you. It turns out, there are two. On May 25, between 4:30PM and 5:00PM the Manitoba Teachers' Society is holding a Rally to Support Public Education on the steps of the Manitoba Legislature. All of you are invited; the ITA delegates to Provincial Council will be there. The Interlake School Division has seen its provincial funding drop year after year after year. With the election of the new government, not only has inflation eroded the purchasing power of the division, the actual dollars flowing to the division have been cut. And that is why the rally is at the legislature, not 2nd Avenue North. Our board has done its best with these diminishing resources to keep class sizes manageable, but the fact remains we will have roughly 60 more students in the school division than we had two years ago, with 2.3 fewer teachers to educate them. We believe proper funding of education is an investment, not an expense. Very few of you signed up to attend the Faculty of Education so that one day you could be part of a union. No, you did it because you love working with children and you want to do your best, so they can be at their best. We campaign for the working conditions of teachers because that means we are campaigning for the learning conditions of students. I know the timing is tight, but if you can all make it to the legislature on Friday, May 25 at 4:30 PM we would love to have you join us to let the government know we care about kids so much we made it our day job, and that's why we don't care for the cuts.
