Benefits Pension Sustainability Seminar for Interlake Teachers

(Please note this is <u>NOT</u> pre-retirement seminars)

You are invited to attend the Lakewood region **virtual presentation for teachers of Interlake Teachers' Association on Thursday, March 18, 2021 from 4:30 to 7:00 pm.** The seminar is specific to the long-term sustainability of your pension and some projections on what it will resemble if some benefits change. The sessions are generic to any MTS member, and you may attend any one of them listed at <u>www.mbteach.org</u>.

This session is sponsored by The Manitoba Teachers' Society. The objective is to help you understand aspects of your pension, prepare for retirement, and *consider potential changes to the Pension*. While the pension is in good shape, the other party to your pension, the Province, has indicated that they wish to discuss the pension, and teacher pensions across the country have changed, or are changing.

Resource persons from MTS *and* The Teachers' Retirement Allowances Fund (TRAF) will be in attendance. Time has been built in for questions from participants.

Prior to the seminar, we encourage you to login to your TRAF Online Services account to download your most recent TRAF Benefits Statement (located under "My TRAF Documents") and your Teacher History record (located under "My Teaching Account"). If you have not yet signed up for Online Services, you can register through the TRAF website at <u>www.traf.mb.ca</u>.

To register for the seminar online go to the MTS website at <u>www.mbteach.org</u>, log in at **My Profile**ⁱ, click on the header **Events** and from the drop-down menu choose **Event Listings**, scroll down and click **the applicable Pension Sustainability Seminar** to complete the registrations process.

Rapid Testing FAST PASS ACCESS FOR ALL STAFF

To be eligible for a rapid test, education staff must:

- Have symptoms of COVID-19; or
- Be identified as a close contact of a school exposure; or
