MB Gov Long-awaited Education Action Plan - MTS Cautiously Optimistic

This month the Manitoba government released <u>Manitoba's K to 12 Education Action Plan: A Roadmap in Response to the Recommendations of the Commission on K to 12 Education</u>. The long-awaited do-over of the Better Education Starts Today (BEST) document represents a distinct and welcome departure in tone and focus and is rooted in the <u>K-12 Commission</u> recommendations.

The Action Plan features a shift in position in a number of key areas:

- Principals and vice principals will remain within the teacher bargaining unit,
- "Business managers" will not be appointed to leadership positions within schools,
- Existing school boards will not be consolidated into six to eight regional boards,
- The current school trustee model remains in place, and,
- There are no immediate plans for new legislation affecting public education.
